ICRI COMMITTEE 140, LIFE CYCLE PERFORMANCE & COST

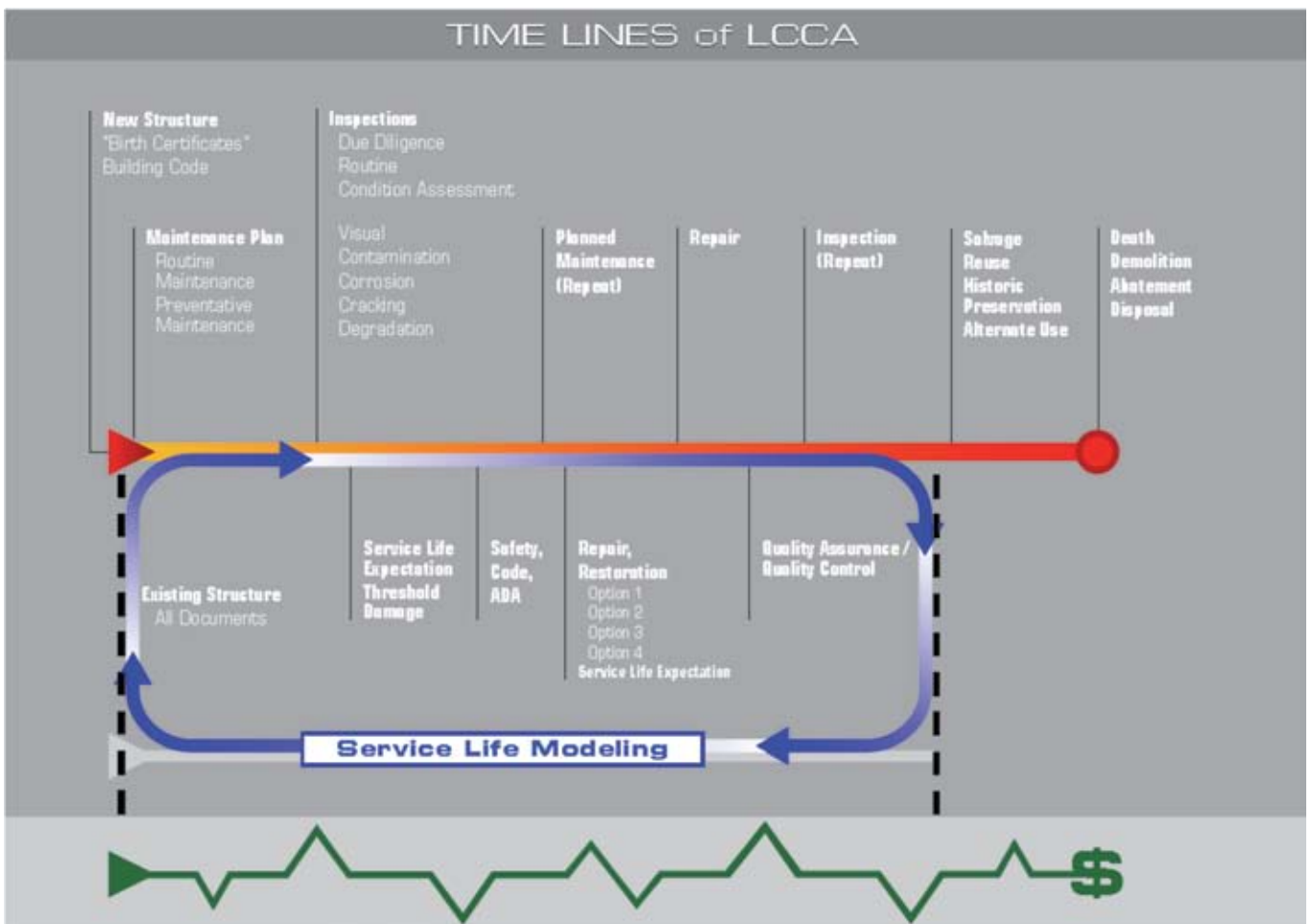
This committee was organized in 2007 and the current Chair is Paul Tourney, PE.

The committee's mission is to "provide industry guidance for decisions based on both service extension and economic impact of concrete repairs."

This committee is currently working on meeting its main goal of developing a "Guideline for Service Life Management of Concrete and Masonry Structures." It is working on developing a "cradle-to-grave" approach using preventative maintenance systems and quality concrete repairs. The guideline will be a tool for property managers, owners, engineers, and

contractors. The following graphic gives one conceptual idea as to what will be included in the guideline. The first draft should be available for the ICRI 2012 Fall Convention. The committee members have been meeting via Web meetings to accelerate progress on completing the draft. The committee is working closely with ICRI Committee 210, Evaluation, and ACI Committee 365, Service Life Prediction.
